Misuse of surveys in PR campaigns

Petra is concerned at the misuse of surveys in PR campaigns and the resulting overload of 'data' on the public (which frequently contradicts existing health or other information). During the workshop she will highlight some recent data from PR surveys, explain how such surveys operate and discuss how this source of public statistics could be challenged or tackled.

#### 7. Diana Kornbrot, University of Hertfordshire

'Quality'? indicators from combining Likert items and other measures from surveys Single quality indicators are often derived from weighted sums of survey items, including ordinal Likert items. It is widely believed that the weights and combining procedures don't make much difference to the final rankings or scores. This presentation challenges this assumption using examples from the National Student Survey of UK higher education and country development indices.
