Have the cutbacks in statistical budgets undermined the statistical base?

This is the title of a session at the Royal Statistical Society's conference early in September 2012. RadStats has been asked to contribute to the session, after the UK Statistics Authority and the National Statistician have made their own assessments. The invitation is partly a result of items on the Radical Statistics blog (http://radstats.wordpress.com/reducedstatistics/).

We have 20 minutes at the conference but would like to gather sufficient evidence to also produce written summaries that can have a more lasting impact. After an email appeal, seven of us are working to these ends, with help from a student at Manchester University, Tom Clarke. We have constituted ourselves as a RadStats subgroup. We examining financial statistics reported by government are departments, supporting a survey of local authority researchers on how the cuts have affected research outputs, staffing and budgets, and gathering evidence to summarise the impacts on statistics of education, health and housing.

Any assessment of the impact of the cuts is hampered because 'the statistical base' is not a category retrievable consistently from financial and staff reporting. Research, data collection and data analysis are mixed up with development of administrative systems and policy management. We hope that the resources of the UKSA and the National Statistician will be best placed to make an assessment of the size of the cuts. A RadStats contribution may be more able to highlight impacts on sensitive political issues, to explore the impact on statistics of shifts from public to private provision of services, to highlight changes in quality of statistical and research services, to give some historical (and therefore hopeful) perspective, and to explore how decisions on cutbacks have been made.
