Privacy policy

This privacy policy outlines the processes Radical Statistics Group (Radstats) follows when storing and handling personal data.

The data controller is Radical Statistics, 27/2 Hillside Crescent, Edinburgh EH7 5EF.

This policy was updated on 22 May 2018 to document our processes in line with the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

Data types collected

Radstats collects two types of personal information:

- Names and email addresses for the purpose of our email list.
- Names, street addresses, email addresses, phone numbers and other relevant data for the purpose of delivering subscription copies of the print journal.

Radstats does not collect any sensitive or special personal data.

Email list

All subscribers to our mailing list have explicitly opted in and consented to receive Radical Statistics's emails, which includes updates about articles, notifications of relevant events, and occasional news. The GDPR lawful basis for this data processing is consent.

Our email list is never shared with any third party. Access to the email list is limited to CSE staff and the Executive Board (the "Troika").

We will retain this data for as long as you remain subscribed to the list. You can opt out from our email list at any time.

Journal subscriber data

When you sign up and pay for a subscription to Radical Statistics, Radstats will save that data for the purposes of delivering that subscription to you for the duration of your subscription.

Your street address will be used only for the purpose of printing mailing labels to post your copy of the magazine to you.

Payment data

Radstats does not see or store any sensitive payment information such as credit card details.
