Radical Statistics – Treasurer's report for the year to 31st December 2022 AGM 25th March 2023

For the second year running RadStats has had an excess of income over expenditure. However, the amount of the surplus was £251, much less than the 2021 surplus of £1591.

Income

The income in 2020 from subscriptions was nearly £900 more than that in 2019.

The conference generated an income of £1106. The conference was held as a Zoom-enabled event, and incurred no cost.

Expenditure

RadStats' largest item of expenditure is the journal. The cost of the RadStats journal in 2022 was much less than in 2020 and 2021.

Most of the expenditure in the Administrative expenses line is postage for mailing the newsletter.

Holding two conferences on Zoom without incurring any costs strengthened the financial position of RadStats. This benefit will not be available in future.
