Minutes:

- 2. Radical Statistics Editors report Roy Carr-Hill

As stated, we are looking for more volunteers, to allow Roy to step back or step down. We warmly welcome Irina our new Book Review Editor and will be introducing another new member Sara, joining Roy, Sean Demack, Irina Motoc and Eileen Magnello.

3 issues since last conference. Working to a 50 page limit per to reduce postage 'cliff'. Could we move to 4/year? Will try this year, not committed to every year. All the Editors thanked.

3. Troika report – David Lamb

Troika has been able to keep a light touch on running the organisation. Essay competition, Conference committee both supported successful. A mid-year smaller event did not take place. Will try again to do so this year. It would provide the possibility of in-person, perhaps returning to a wintertime, virtual event. John B & Roy C-H will lead, aiming for late September.

A topic or theme will be developed, possibly bringing in new members. It could focus on expanding the group generally.

- 4. Treasurer's report David Lamb [appended] Finances are healthy, in the black (for the first time in ages). One lump sum came in, subscriptions are up a little, and the conference incurred almost no costs. There have been some generous replies to the appeal for donations. This allows a bit flexibility, and for example allowing free student memberships.
- 5. Membership report Alistair Cairns [appended] Still quite a few paying at old rates, AC will remind again. How effectively is RS recruiting members?
- 6. Conference organisers report David Byrne

Feels it was successful. Excellent talks, decent participation. A live event would be desirable, likely Sheffield, with a union theme of some sort.

7. 2023 Conference – Sean Demack

Sean will be looking for people to help. Open to suggestions of theme. Reiterates a live event would be preferable. Venue needs to be found. Perhaps hold it a bit later in the year to let winter doldrums subside. March 25 is last Saturday in March. Union involvement would be good. Bob Jeffery, who is active in Sheffield Trades Council, will be helpful, looking at developing next year's conference

8. Essay competition – Dave Byrne

David has developed a theme, and can judge entries. Suggests this be circulated on email lists, to broaden participation. Diana K offers to judge. Deadline extended to end June,2022. RSS also runs one, so RS needs to be distinct. Irina M offers to help promote. She'll circulate text of note and suggest where to circulate, which could be added to. This should be on the website, and pushed on social media to reach a younger demographic.

9. Website/social media report – Robin Rice [appended] Website is up to date but largely the same. Only 5 blog posts this year. Please provide Robin with content (essay comp for example). Twitter numbers are up, making quite an impact, particularly with non-members. Facebook is stable. Largest 'reach' was over 50, with promotion this can multiply 5-fold. Irina and Robin will discuss establishing an Instagram account. Some feel it is worth boycotting any Meta products, or at least not pay for advertising. To be discussed further. Facebook might be in decline, Twitter is better politically. Radstats now has a YouTube channel!

As ever, RS should be thinking of how best to reach new and interesting 'audiences'.

10. JISC mail report – Alison Macfarlane

Each list has over 400 members, not the same people. Some dip into the discussion, the 'announce' list is for members' notifications. On the discussion list there continue to be inappropriate language. 'Sensible' discussions encouraged, and too many postings discouraged. Almost all are clearly UK but there are a suspicious number that appear to be from USA but Alison suspects this is wrong. Rachel Cohen, Alison and Irina were intending to write guidelines – they will try to do so this year.

11. Any other business

Harvey Goldstein topic – (Diana K) Would like to see some memorial. Could the essay competition be named after him? Agreed.

Archives – (Alison M) Decades ago RS papers were shared. RS is fairly open: all newsletter, reports for last decade and the last couple of virtual conferences are available. See archive.org, where you can see old RS websites archived.
