Statisticians scorn Fowler's NHS activity figures

A group of statisticians has poured scorn on the latest batch of NHS activity figures produced by the Department of Health.

The publication of the latest statistical bulletin by Health Secretary Norman Fowler has been timed to coincide with the Conservative Party Conference in Blackbool this week.

Fowler's NHS 'is the best'

Mr Norman Fowler, the Social Services Secretary, released statistics last night to show that the national health service was better run and provided more services under his control than under any other minister since 1948.

The figures, released before next week's Conservative party conference, use partient attendance and out patient appointsments to show that record numbers of people are being treated.
