Formed in 1975, 'RadStats' are a collection of statisticians, researchers and activists who share a common concern about the political use and misuse of statistics. Members are 'radical' in being committed to helping to build a more free, democratic, and egalitarian society.

RadStats are particularly concerned about

- The mystifying use of technical language to disguise social problems
- The lack of control by the community over what & how statistical investigations are conducted and interpreted.
- The power structures within which statistical and research workers are employed.
- The fragmentation of social problems into specialist fields, obscuring connectedness.

"We believe that statistics can be used to support radical campaigns for progressive social change. Statistics should inform, not drive policies. Social problems should not be disguised by technical language"
